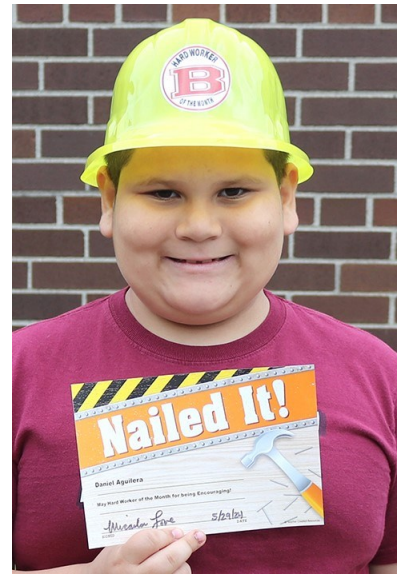


Elloise Buyea
