## **HOME-INSTRUCTION OVERVIEW OF RESPONSIBILITIES**

## THE PARENT IS REQUIRED TO:

- Submit to the district superintendent a Letter of Intention to educate your child at home by July 1 each year, or within 14 days of commencing home instruction.
- Submit a separate, written Individual Home Instruction Plan (IHIP) for each child being instructed at home. A single set of documents may not be used for more than one child. A separate plan must be submitted for each child individually. IHIP's are due by August 15 or within 4 weeks of receiving a response to a letter of intent from the District, whichever is later.

If notified that the IHIP submitted is not acceptable, a revised IHIP correcting the deficiencies must be submitted within 15 days of the notification, or by September 15, whichever is later.

- 3. Submit **four (4) Quarterly Reports** on or before the dates specified on the IHIP. This can be submitted electronically.
- Submit a separate Annual Assessment for each child being instructed at home at the time the 4<sup>th</sup> Quarterly Report is submitted. This can be submitted electronically.

Submit a remedial plan to correct deficiencies if notified to do so by the school district.

5. Conduct all communication with the appropriate offices of the school district of residence.

### THE SCHOOL DISTRICT WILL:

- 1. Respond to the Letter of Intention and provide appropriate information including a copy of the Commissioner's Regulation 100.10 and an IHIP form.
- Upon receipt by the superintendent, refer each IHIP for compliance review to the Coordinator of Curriculum Services for compliance review. Parents will be informed by August 31 or within 10 business days of receipt; whichever is later, of compliance ruling.

Revised IHIP's must be reviewed and parents notified of their compliance within 15 days of receipt or by September 15, whichever is later.

- 3. Review each Quarterly Report and notify parents if reports are not acceptable.
- 4. If progress is determined to be substandard, notify parents that they are on probationary status and that a remedial plan is required with the IHIP for the next school year.
- 5. Provide technical assistance, when requested, in developing an IHIP, providing curriculum information, arranging for testing, etc.
